Join JB Tours of Ohio for a week full of southern charm.

Start your journey with a stop at the Ivy Green. Built in 1820, Ivy Green, the birthplace of Helen Keller, is a simple white clapboard home design in typical Southern architecture. The home and museum room are decorated with much of the original furniture of the Keller family. Each is highlighted by hundreds of Miss Keller's personal mementos. Of particular note is her complete library of Braille books and her original Braille typewriter.

Then proceed to Bellingrath gardens & Home. Tour where there is always something blooming. Enjoy more than 400 varieties of camellias, Alabama's State Flower. The Bellingrath Home appears as it did in the Bellingraths' era. The 15-room was built in 1935 with all the original furnishings on display.

Also visit the History Museum of Mobile from pre-Colonial contact to the modern Port City. Here explore a French ship, play real African drums, try on colonial clothing, practice basket weaving and more.

Enjoy dinner on the water while cruising along the river on the Perdido Queen which features live entertainment.

Another exciting stop is the Alabama Aquarium at the Dauphin Island Sea Lab an exciting educational venue highlighting the four key habitats of coastal Alabama: the Mobile Tensaw River Delta, Mobile Bay, the Barrier Islands, and the Northern Gulf of Mexico. This facility has 31 aquariums. The Alabama Aquarium showcases the plants, animals and other natural resources found in the estuary and it surrounding marine habitats.

And no trip to Mobile Alabama would complete without a visit to the Original Oyster House seafood restaurant.
